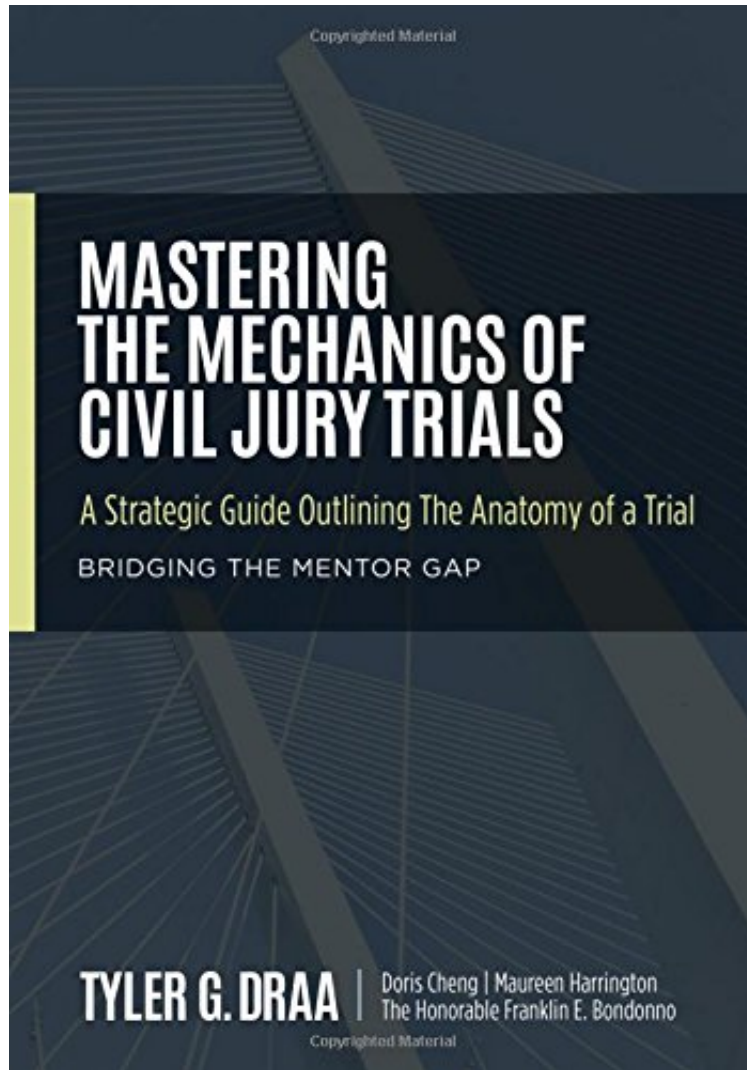

With involvement in 60 trials, at least 40 of which were seen through to judgment, cases included medical malpractice, negligent injury, toxic tort, civil rights and other cases in multiple states, including California, New York, North Carolina, Washington, D.C., Oregon, and Hawaii. His longest case ran almost five months in 1981, in Los Angeles. Justice Bondonno received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Pacific Union College and his Juris Doctorate at Santa Clara University. He is a member of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers and resides in Los Gatos, CA.
