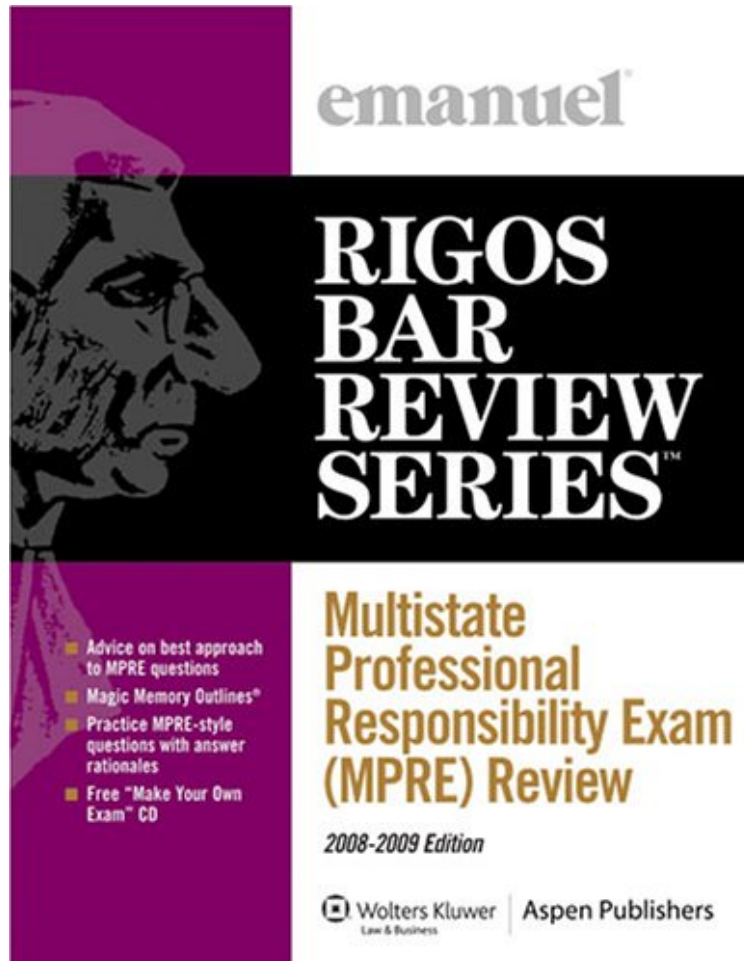

JohnsonThe biggest problem I have with this book is that the questions are much more difficult than the actual MPRE questions. This forces you to study a lot of non-essential material that is simply not necessary to pass this test. I suppose if you want to pass by a very wide margin, and don't mind doing a ton of extra work to do so, you can take this approach. But why

would you? I believe the best strategy is to focus on what is actually tested using the BARBRI or KAPLAN materials. For around the same amount as the other programs, you get audio lectures on CD, test questions with comprehensive answers, practice exams and access to online lectures and test prep materials as well. With all of these options, your individual learning style is covered. Personally, I did not find the Magic Memory outlines that helpful, but the regular outlines followed the audio cd well enough; so you can hear and see the info at the same time, which helped me with retention. The questions are more difficult than what I encountered on the actual exam but in working through them, I learned the little details that enabled me to do well on test day. Use in combination with Strategies and Tactics By Dave Use this book along with the online BarOutlines.com, Strategies and Tactics, and the official MPRE released questions from their web site and you'll do fine. The March 09 exam had NO multipart questions which was a shock - I and III but not IV, etc. This book gives you great outlines and plenty of questions. BUT, be careful, some of the answers are wrong so know your code and trust your knowledge. Having not had to take an ethics exam for the first two states years ago, I went overboard to make sure I passed. I kept doing questions, making my own outlines, and reading the code. Ended up with 120 when all I needed in TX was 85. Understand how the score is scaled before beating yourself up trying to get 85% correct since that is not what they require.
