Good Research Guide, PA Specifics Not Necessary By Joseph PLI think this a good practical guide to legal research, but any good, generic legal research book will do just as well. In the interest of full disclosure, I was required by a professor/author to purchase this book for a class. If you are a non-lawyer looking only to find PA law, this might be a good purchase. However, it will not help you find do-it-yourself materials and much of it is aimed at finding information on Westlaw and Lexis/Nexis which are expensive search engines. The law library material might be more accessible, but it will be dense and confusing to someone without a legal education or background. And if you can get access to a law library you are almost certainly better off speaking with a librarian to find what you need. If you are a law student, I would advise saving your money. You will learn this material in LRW, through a Librarian, or from a Westlaw or Lexis representative, by phone 24-hours a day or in person at your school. Westlaw and Lexis are fairly easy to use and the representatives are always available by phone to walk you through your research. At Temple University my Westlaw rep gave a 30 minute class where we set up a PA tab on our homepage with all of the Pennsylvania resources on one page. As for library materials, the same applies as above: speak to a librarian or take a tour/introduction where they will inform you where all of the state specific materials are located (Pennsylvania law is under "P" for Pennsylvania). If you are a barred attorney or other legal professional who has just moved to PA or will be doing considerable business in the Commonwealth or with its laws then this may be a concise and helpful guide to PA legal research.
