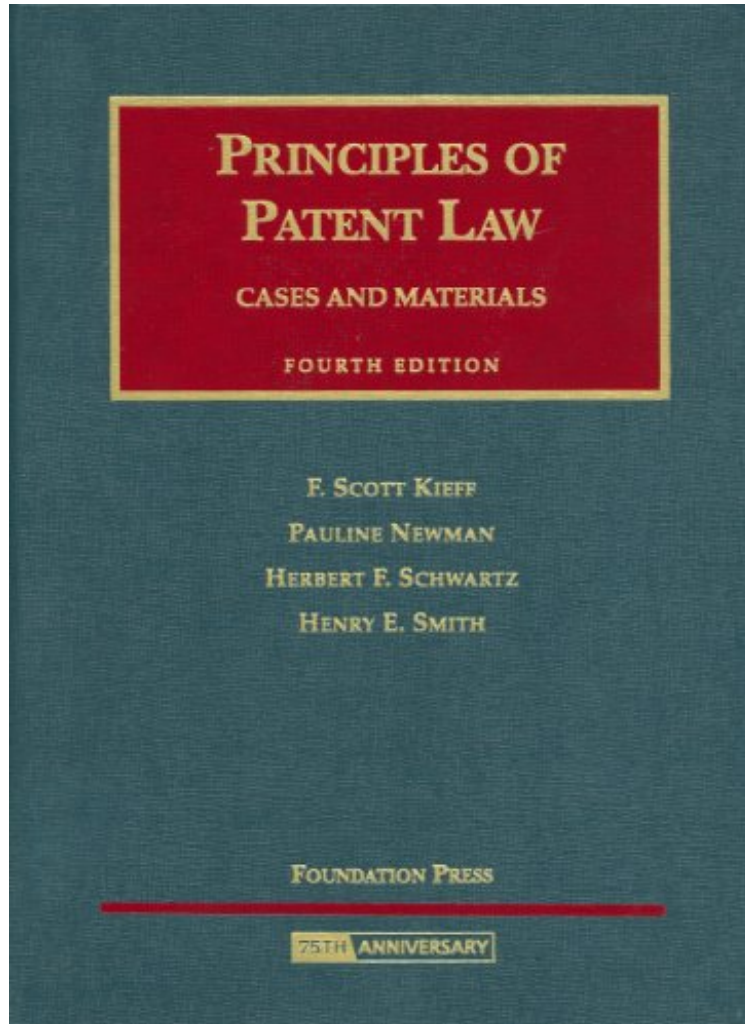

I bought this book for my patent law class. As a 2L student and a registered patent agent, I am of the opinion that this book provides a solid, intermediate-level foundation for patent law study. It covers the most important doctrines and cases in patent law. The book is more in depth than Mueller's introductory book. If you wish to learn more details of patent law, you can do your further readings on specialized material such as Kayton's treatise. The book is written in a style suitable for a law class, so you don't have

law school experience, you may not be used to the presentation of the material. The real learning of patent law comes only with your actual legal practice, but this book provides you the basic knowledge to help you start your patent practice. That said, I was going to give it five stars, but then I see a section discussing CPA (continuing prosecution applications under 2002 law) which is completely out of date. While in many other respects this book seems quite current, I was disappointed to see that not all sections have been updated.
