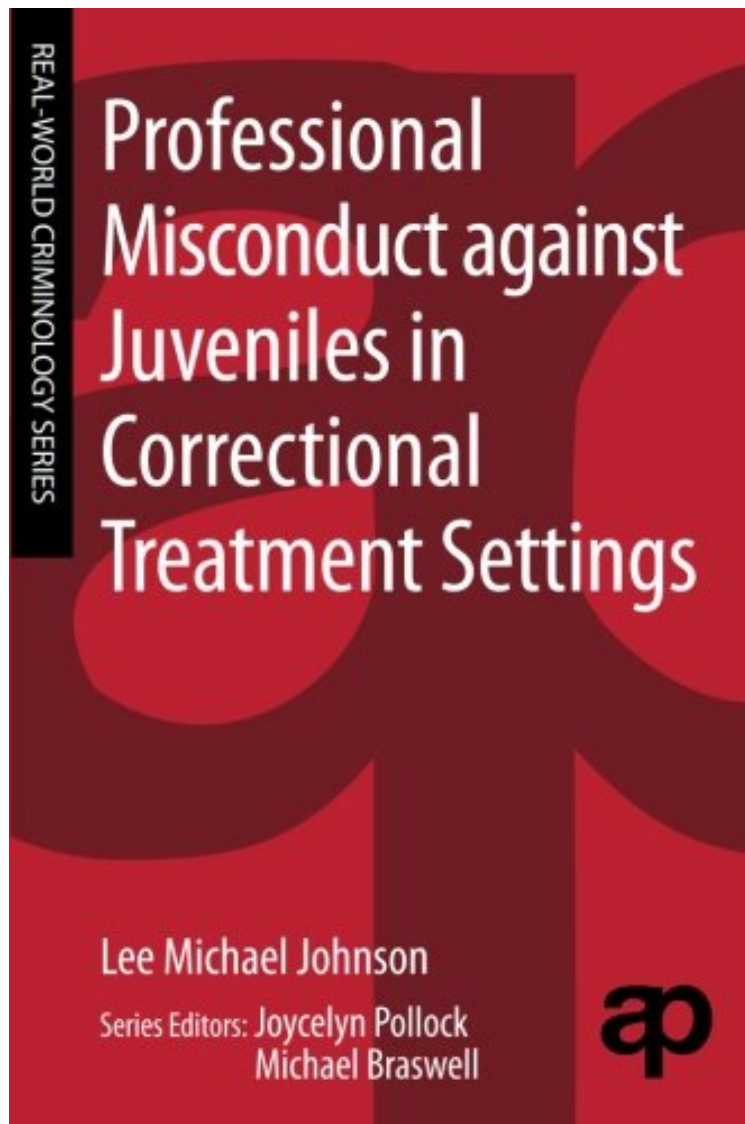

A significant barrier to successful juvenile intervention is misconduct committed against juveniles by the persons employed to help them.
