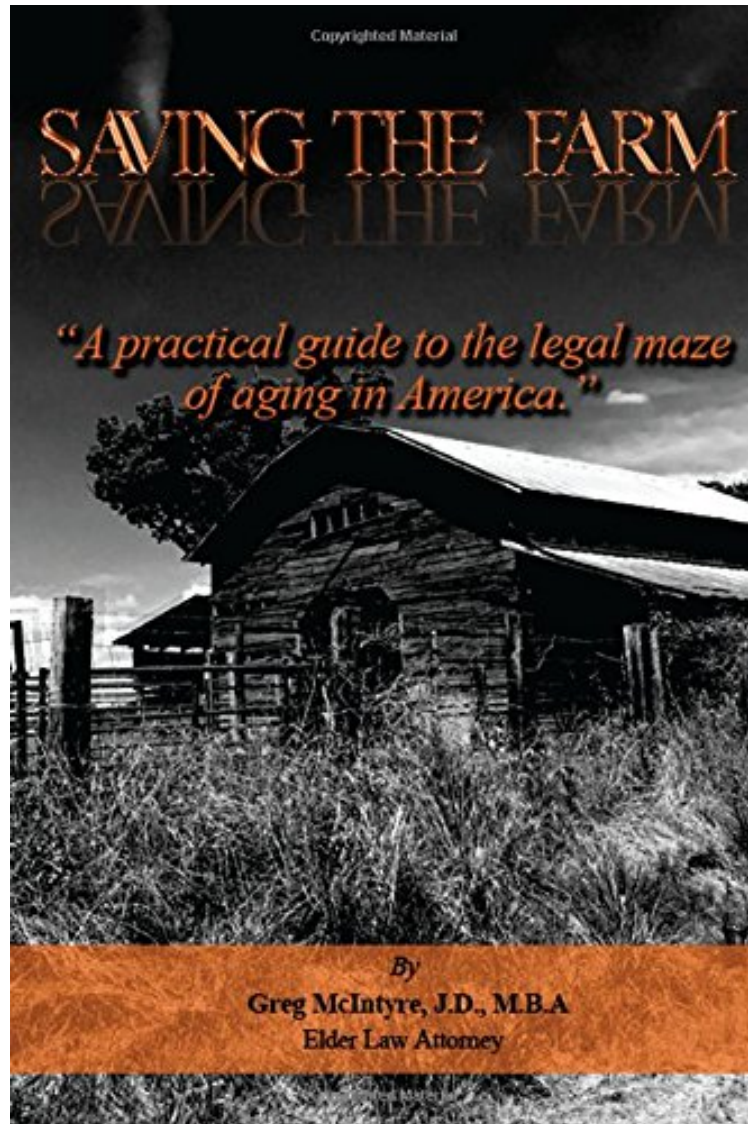

While aging happens slowly, the events that I have been faced with came on rapidly and unexpectedly.I am a senior with elderly parents, and my parents began experiencing serious illnesses - broken hip, kidney failure, dementia, and other lesser but important health problems - and I desperately needed an education - and fast.I always begin by doing research, and I was becoming aware of the need for information on consequences that may occur. In the beginning, dealing with legal issues was of concern, but as time went on, healthcare issues such as home versus institutional healthcare, medicare and insurance, as well as about dementia and how I could provide Mom and Dad with the best care had to be dealt with immediately. Boy was I in for an education about these things as well as asset depletion, Medicaid, and how decisions made could, indeed, "lose the farm".What I didn't know to look for that I found in this book was that even though my parents had all of the standard documents, that wasn't enough to adequately protect themselves, their savings, their home, and their beach property.I also learned about probate, how complicated and expensive it can be, and that with any assets at all, you almost always need an attorney.
